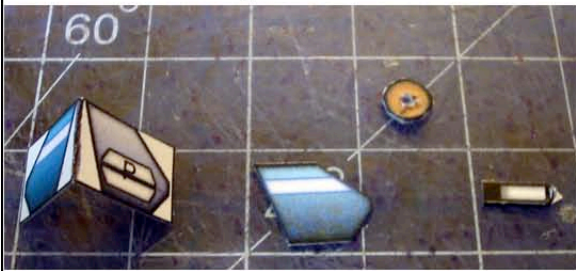
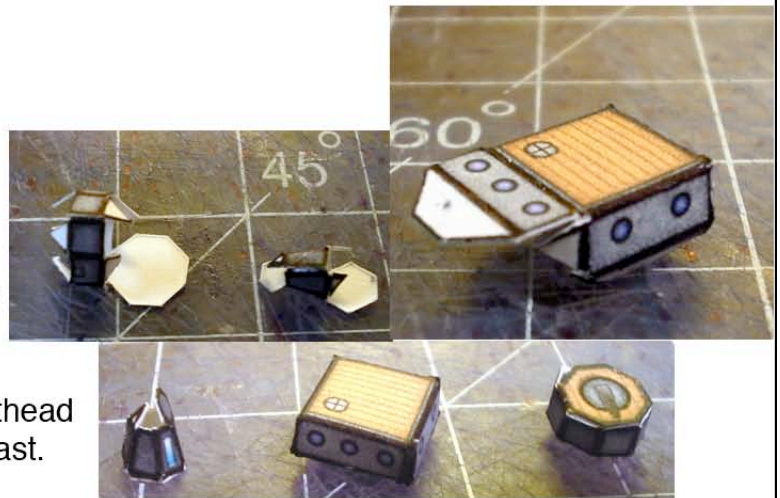


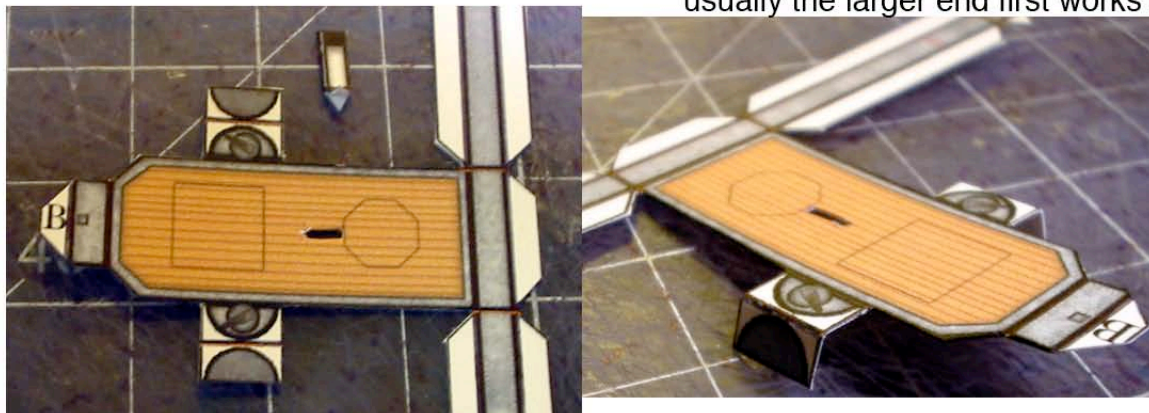
The Eagle class rocket sloop is probably the easiest to construct model that I've designed for 1/600 so far. Fold over and glue the lower hull, taking care not to glue together the flaps for the tailfins. After cutting out the lower hull you can color over the resulting white edges with a sharpie, dry erase marker, or thinned out black paint.



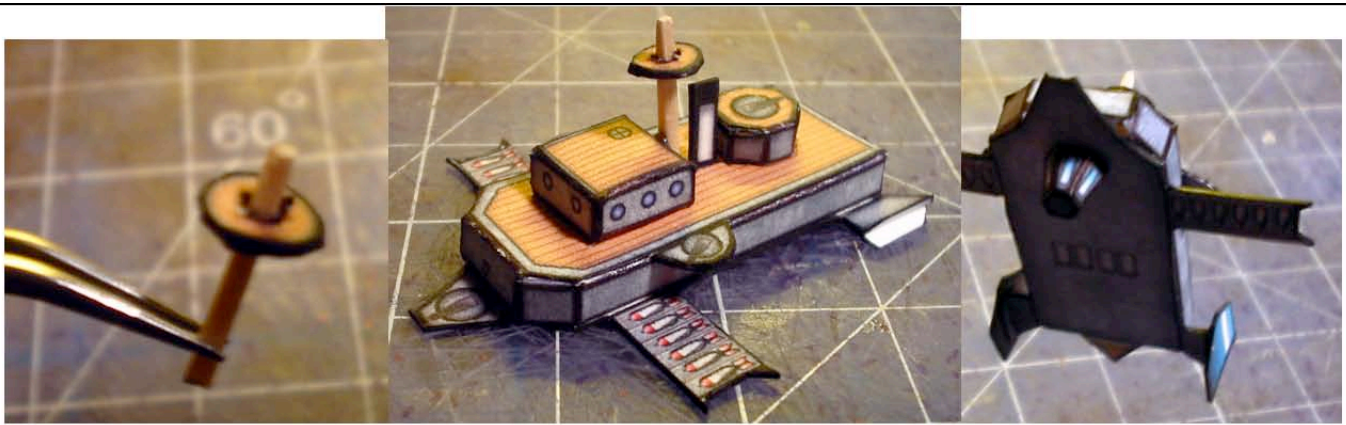
The tailfins, smokestack, and masthead are also flat foldovers like the lower hull. They are assembled as shown in the picture above. I've drilled out the center of the masthead so that later on I can put it on a toothpick mast.



The stern turret, compass house and bridge are just a box and cylinders. Glue the cylinders into a ring shape first, then glue one end shut, usually the larger end first works best.



The upper hull is also just a big box, remember to cut out the hole for the smokestack before assembling this piece. You can put the smokestack in later as there is no bottom to this piece. The little wing sponsons fold under, get glued, then cut out before assembling the rest of the upper hull. The piece with the 'B' folds down last and represents the bow of the vessel.

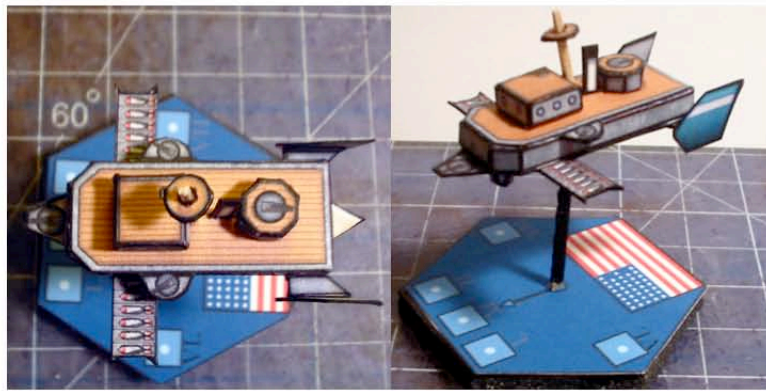


After you've assembled the upper hull, glue it down to the flat lower hull section. The bridge and stern turret pieces glue into place where the 1px outlines are that correspond to the shapes of the pieces. I didn't use a grey fill this time as I am trying to leave the models open to modular ideas and other configuration possibilities.

Use the mast guide to cut a toothpick or piece of steel wire to 14mm in length, then glue the masthead on at 4mm from one end. The mast then glues to the back of the cabin as shown.

The compass house glues onto the bottom of the hull where indicated (forgot to leave that guide open, sorry), the blue windows should face forward.

The tailfins then glue onto either side, white stripe up.

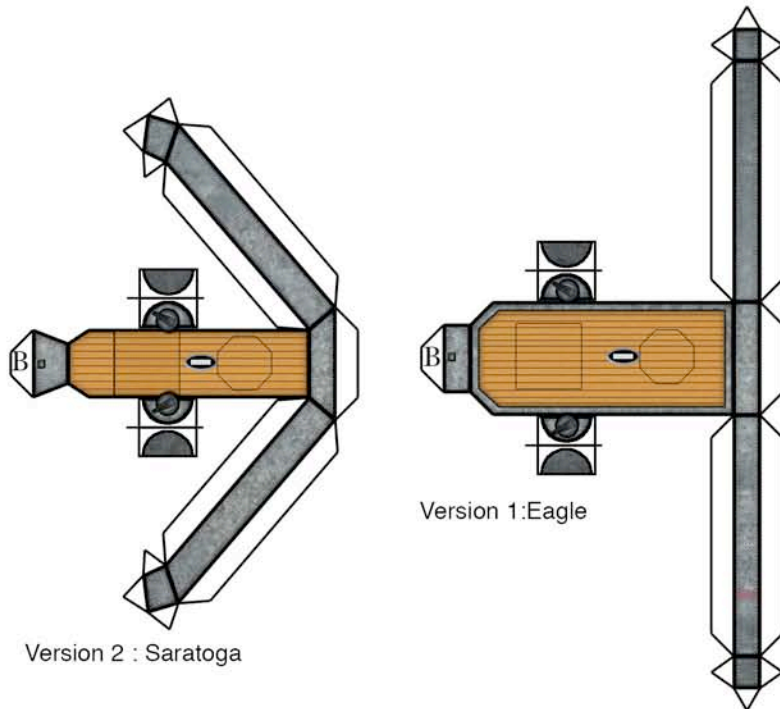
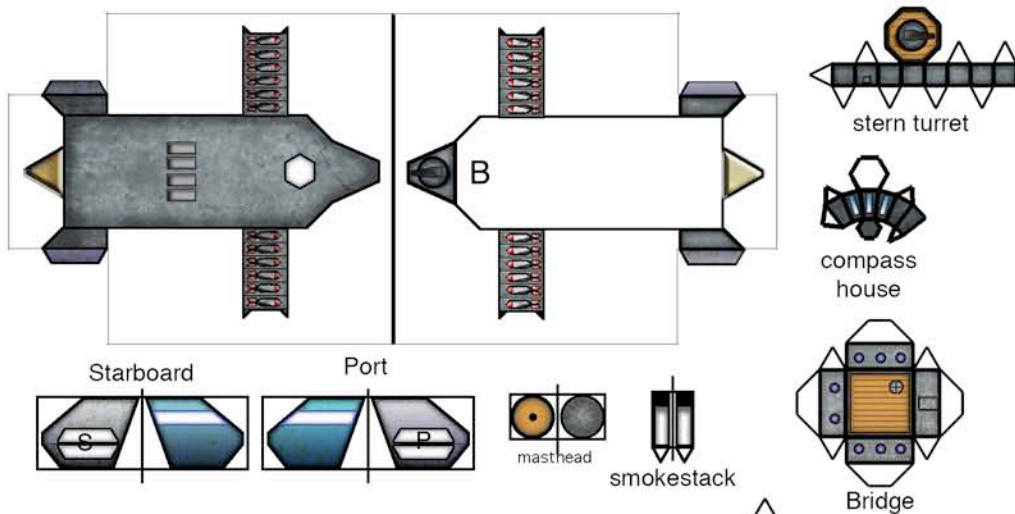


For the flight base I used the rest of the toothpick that was left after I cut off the mast. I drilled a small hole for the toothpick just for'ard of the bomb bay doors.

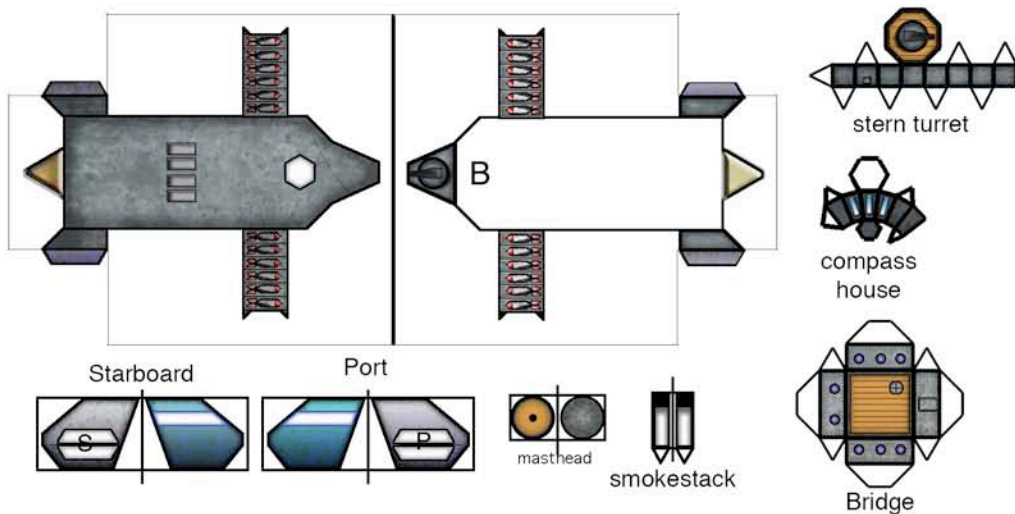
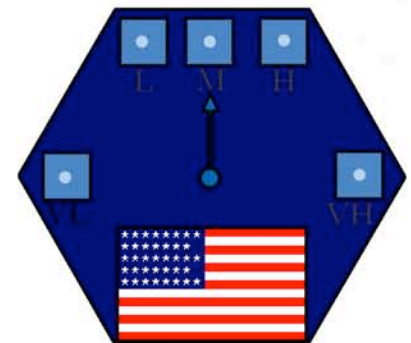
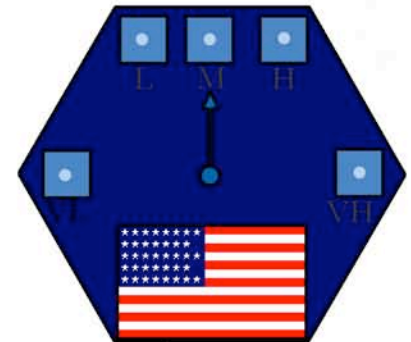
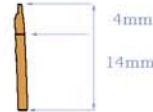
The flag I used for the U.S. Aeronaval forces is the 1877 38 star version.

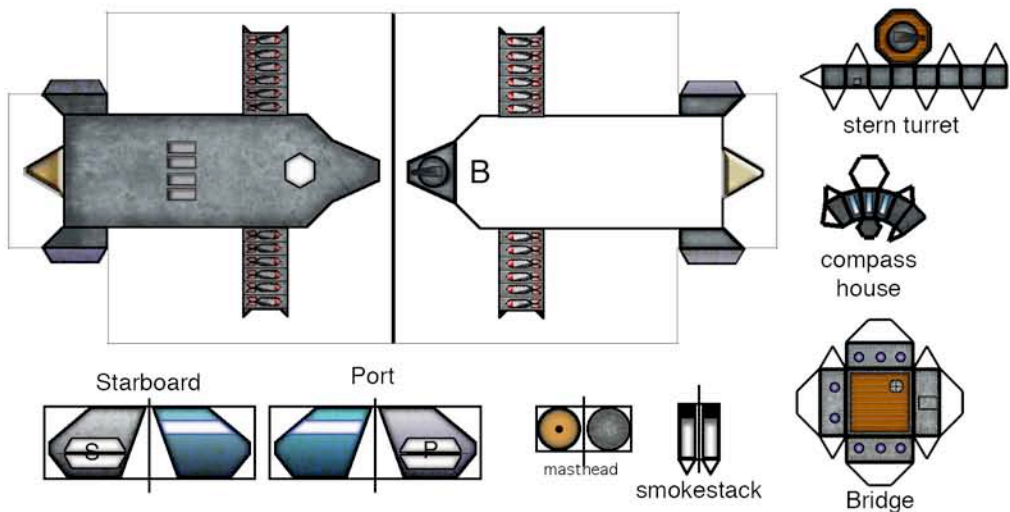
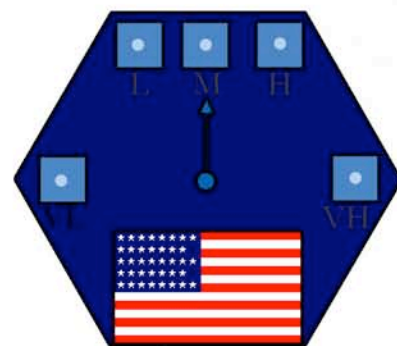
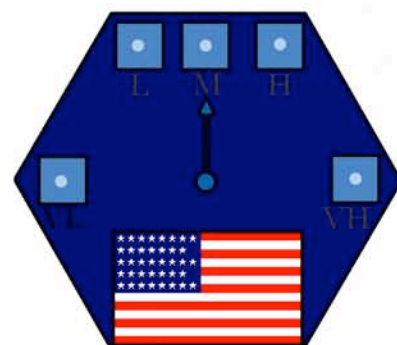
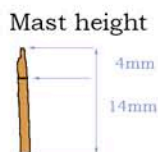
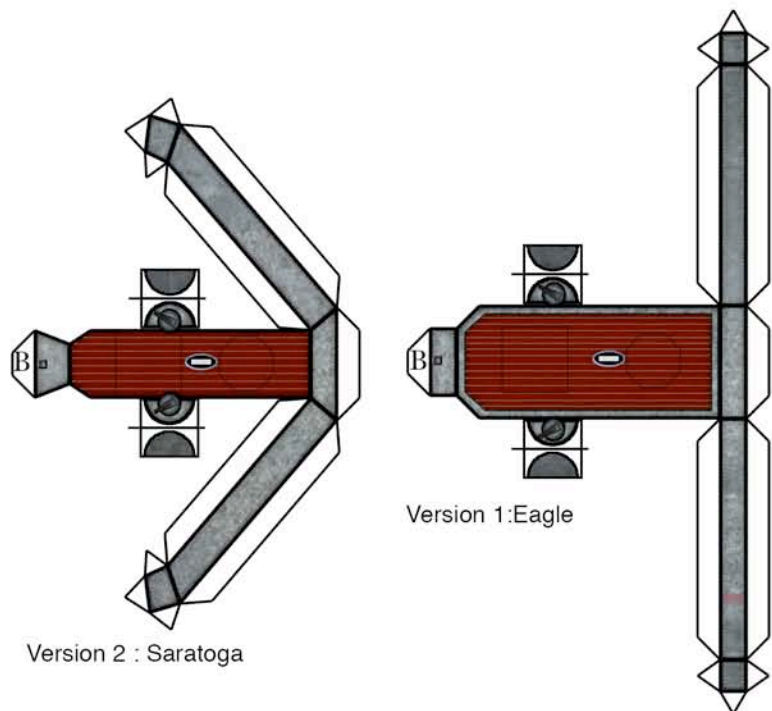
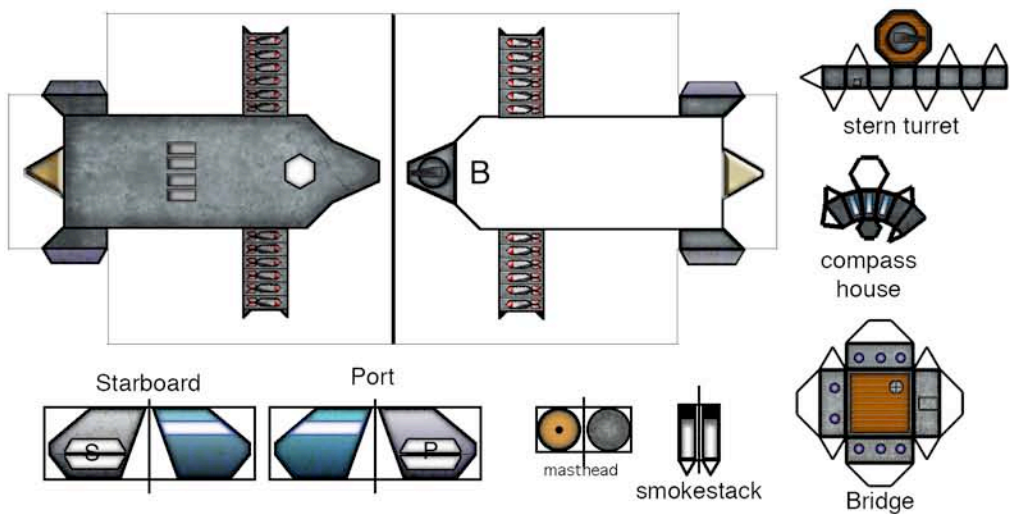


Mast height



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
